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### CICJIS Structure

- ▶ HB 05-1078 defines governing body and structure
- ▶ Five state agencies represented: Colorado State Judicial, Dept. of Public Safety (CBI), Dept. of Corrections, Dept. of Human Services (DYC), and the Colorado District Attorneys Council.
- ▶ Governing body composed of Executive Directors and State Court Administrator
- ▶ CICJIS performs information transfers (for example Warrants, Arrests, Case Filings) and data queries between the five partner agencies
- ▶ CICJIS does not collect data by statute, system of records are the partner agencies

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### Why the need to share data via CICJIS?

- ▶ Partner agency record systems are not compatible
- ▶ Solve defined business needs
- ▶ Eliminate redundant data entry
- ▶ Increase data accuracy
- ▶ Increase public and officer safety, staff productivity

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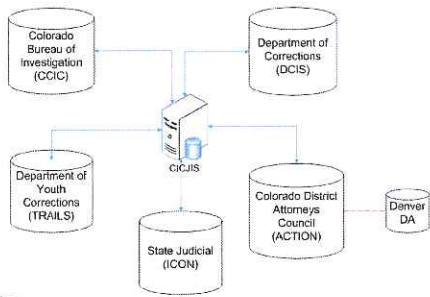
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### CICJIS Design View



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### Why do Colorado State Troopers collect race and ethnicity data on citizens?

- In 2007, the Colorado State Patrol (CSP) received funding from the Colorado Department of Transportation to develop a system, or database, that would prevent discrimination on traffic stops.
- The cornerstone of the system is based upon data collection that provides the agency and public with statistics that show whether or not CSP troopers are making traffic stops based upon an individual's ethnicity/race.
- The database that was selected was Microsoft SharePoint.




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### How do Colorado State Troopers collect race and ethnicity data from citizens?

- Colorado State Troopers document a citizen's race and ethnicity on the "Contact Form" after any traffic stop where a citizen is given a warning or citation, or is arrested for a violation of the law.




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### How do Colorado State Troopers determine a citizen's race/ethnicity?

- Race and Ethnicity are not displayed on a driver's license and/or identification card.

**Primary Criminal Justice Data Uses:**

- Conduct studies mandated by the legislature
- Provide analysis to the Colorado Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice (CCJJ)

**Data Sources**

- ▶ **CBI Data**
  - Criminal history (arrests) for recidivism studies
  - NIBRS data for trend analysis
    - Marijuana arrests
    - Theft of property for CCJJ Sentencing Task Force
  - Requested per study

**Data Sources**

- ▶ **County and District Court data from the Judicial Branch**
  - Used to conduct recidivism and trend analysis studies
  - Direct access to ICON via MOU
  - Denver County Court records requested separately
