

### Description:

The board is charged with developing and establishing state policy for occupational education and governing the state system of community colleges. The board is responsible for the establishment of statewide vocational education policy for all the entities which provide that education and shall coordinate all aspects of vocational education. In its role as the governing authority for the state system of community colleges, the board shall assure a system of two-year program delivery throughout the state coordinated, where appropriate, with the local district colleges.

The board consists of 11 members, 9 of whom are appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate. No more than 5 members can be of the same political party. The members serve 4-year terms and no member may serve more than two consecutive terms. The board must have one member from each congressional district. A vacancy on the board occurs whenever any member moves out of the congressional district from which he was appointed.

An appointed member cannot be an employee of any junior college, community or technical college, school district or agency receiving vocational funds allocated by the board, private institution of higher education, or state or private occupational school in the state. An appointed member cannot be an elected or appointed statewide official of the state of Colorado or member of the governing board of any state-supported institution of higher education.

Members of the board shall be appointed so as to insure that all geographic areas of the state are represented.

The tenth member is a student at a college of a state system of community colleges, and the eleventh member is a member of the faculty of a college of the state system of community colleges. The terms of these non-voting members is one year.
