




Threat Assessment Work Group

- Began work in 2009 meeting 10 times through November 2011 with a participant list of 19 professionals, averaging 10 at each meeting

Threat Assessment Update

- November of 2011 CSSRC then Director, Linda Kanan, was invited to the US Department of Ed to discuss threat assessment. US Secret Service work still considered best practice.
- ACYI/Adams County Schools consulted with the Center and added a screen and Response, Management and Support (RMS) Plan template to the Essentials guide. With their permission we have now incorporated the RMS into the Essentials document.
- Over the last few years, the Essentials document is always one
 of the top five docs downloaded from the CSSRC site.
- Center staff just attended a training with national experts on June 29th & 30th, 2015. "There is no national certification for threat assessment."

Threat Assessment Update


Threat Assessment Trainings:
