Precipitating Behaviors to Violence

- 93% of the perpetrators of targeted school violence exhibited concerning behavior before the attack.
- In 59% of the incidents, more than 1 person had prior knowledge of the attack.
- Of those with prior knowledge of school attacks, 93% were peers of the perpetrators –friends, schoolmates, or siblings.

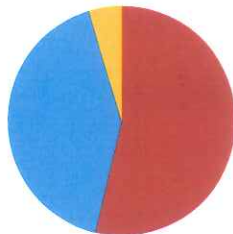

Recovery in the Aftermath

Adolescents experiencing a traumatic event:

- More likely to engage in risky behaviors
- Less likely to make realistic evaluations of danger and safety
- Experience symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Prevention should be a core component of crisis response



Assessment During the Aftermath

- Why did this happen?
- What were the opportunities missed?
- What were the missed warning signs?
- Could this have been prevented?
- Was the perpetrator on our radar?
- What was the accessibility to weapons?
- Transparency vs. Liability
- What went well and what did not?
- What were your efforts to prevent this?

Preventing Violence in Schools

What matters most?

1) Preventing young people from engaging in violence and other problem behaviors

2) Identifying and addressing red flags

- Key Strategy: An effective intelligence-gathering mechanism

Preventing Violence in Schools: Putting Safe2Tell Colorado into Action

- 1) Teach young people that reporting anything related to the safety of anyone is their responsibility.
- 2) Teach young people how to tell a trusted adult that they have a safety concern.
- 3) Create a climate in which young people feel comfortable sharing sensitive information regarding a potentially threatening situation.
- 4) Train adults on how to properly respond to students who provide information.

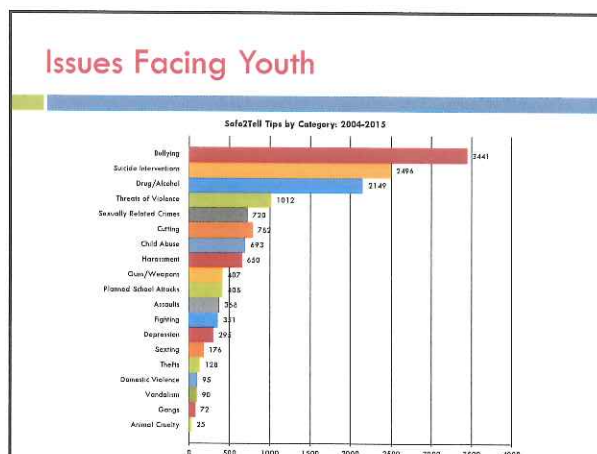
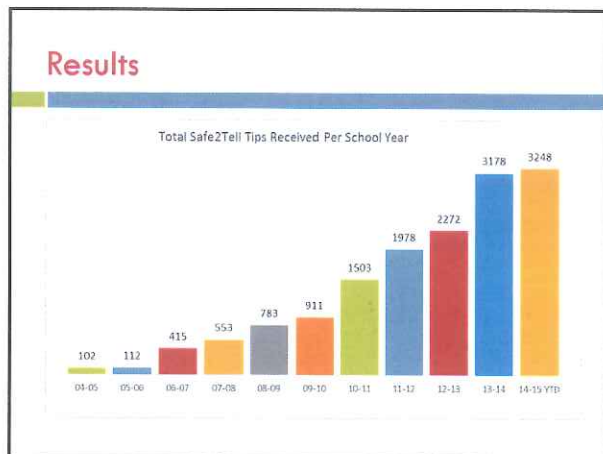
Mobile App Launch
