

**UPDATED SUMMARY
HOUSE BILL 15-1273**

First Regular Session - Seventieth Colorado General Assembly

This summary applies to the reengrossed version of this bill as introduced in the second house. It does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. This summary reflects only the main points of the legislation.

The bill adds ~~sexual assaults~~ *acts of sexual violence* and the unlawful use of marijuana on school grounds, in a school vehicle, or at a school activity or sanctioned event to the current list of conduct and discipline code violations that a school is required to report as part of the safe school reporting requirements. ~~Incidents of sexual assaults~~ *Acts of sexual violence* must only be reported in the aggregate, without any identifying information. The bill clarifies that the term "law enforcement" includes school resource officers.

The division of criminal justice (division) shall compile, *from reports submitted by law enforcement*, and report on the number of arrests, summons, and tickets that occurred on school grounds and the court dispositions of those cases. The division shall prepare a retroactive report using the best available data for the 2013-14 and 2014-15 school years. *The division shall annually post the report on its web site. The division is only required to compile and prepare the reports if existing appropriations or resources are available.*

~~The scheduled post-enactment review of House Bill 12-1345 will now include a review of this bill, including a review of the report to be compiled by the division. The post-enactment review of House Bill 12-1345 is extended to 180 days after the 4-year anniversary of the passage of this bill.~~

During the 2020 legislative session, the education committees of the house of representatives and the senate are encouraged to formally review the reports from the division and discuss whether to continue requiring the submission of data.
