Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that provides a total of \$15,826 General Fund to the Department of Revenue for FY 2014-15. It also appropriates \$1,200 to the Department of Personnel for FY 2014-15, which is from funds appropriated to the Department of Revenue.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2014-15 and FY 2015-16 based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates a total of \$18.5 million General Fund to be available to fund 2015 legislation (including bills like this one

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that may require a General Fund appropriation for FY 2014-15). If the full \$18.5 million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
