

**UPDATED SUMMARY
HOUSE BILL 15-1102**

First Regular Session - Seventieth Colorado General Assembly

This summary applies to the reengrossed version of this bill as introduced in the second house. It does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. This summary reflects only the main points of the legislation.

The "Colorado Cottage Foods Act" exempts sellers of certain foods from state inspection standards. The bill expands the permitted foods to include *flour*, fruit empanadas, tortillas, and pickled vegetables that have an equilibrium pH value of 4.6 or lower.

The bill separates the foods into two tiers and requires the state board of health to promulgate rules for the production and sale of tier two foods.

In addition to the disclaimer required on the products sold, a producer must also display a placard, sign, or card at the point of sale indicating that the product was produced in a home kitchen that is not subject to state licensure or inspection.
