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(b) A LOCAL GOVERNMENT THAT IS USING AN AUTOMATED VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION AND THAT WISHES TO CONTINUE TO USE RED LIGHT CAMERAS SHALL SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING BALLOT QUESTION TO ITS VOTERS AT THE 2017 GENERAL 40 ELECTION: "SHALL [NAME OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT] BE AUTHORIZED TO CONTINUE TO USE AUTOMATED VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION SYSTEMS AT [NAME OF LOCATIONS]?" IF THE VOTERS APPROVE THE BALLOT QUESTION, THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT MAY CONTINUE TO USE AUTOMATED VEHICLE 44 IDENTIFICATION SYSTEMS. IF THE VOTERS DO NOT APPROVE THE BALLOT QUESTION, THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SHALL DISCONTINUE ITS USE OF AUTOMATED VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION SYSTEMS WITHIN TWO MONTHS FOLLOWING THE DATE OF CERTIFICATION OF THE VOTE ON THE BALLOT QUESTION.
