#### AGRICULTURE, LIVESTOCK, & NATURAL RESOURCES

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

**HJR16-1002** be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the House for final action:

Amend printed resolution, page 1, line 6, after "dams" insert "and other structures".

Page 2, line 12, after "dam" insert "or other water storage structure".

Page 2, line 13, strike "a dam located on" and substitute "the structure located on or requiring access through".

Page 2, strike lines 16 through 18 and substitute:

"WHEREAS, In Colorado, there is variation in the extent of communication and cooperation between local branches of federal land management agencies and owners or operators of dams or other water storage structures regarding access to the water structure to maintain, repair,".

Page 2, line 19, strike "dam;" and substitute "structure;".

Page 2, strike lines 20 through 23 and substitute:

"WHEREAS, This lack of communication in some instances has caused problems and, thus, counteracts efforts to maximize our state's water storage capacity and protect water quality and critical natural resources;".

Page 2, strike lines 25 through 28 and substitute:

"WHEREAS, Lack of cooperation and communication could further exacerbate the deteriorating condition of the structure, potentially increasing both the cost to restore the structure to a".

Page 2, line 29, strike "dam" and substitute "structure".

Page 3, strike lines 1 through 3 and substitute "Bureau of Land Management, to communicate and work cooperatively on requests for permission to access a dam or other water storage structure when the purpose of accessing the water storage structure is to maintain, repair, or rehabilitate the water storage structure.".

**HB16-1019** be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:
