41 the Committee on Appropriations with favorable
42 recommendation:

1 Amend reengrossed bill, page 7, after line 19, insert the following:

3 **"SECTION 3.** Article 5 of title 23, Colorado Revised Statutes, is
4 amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to read:

5 **23-5-101.9. Repeal.** THIS SECTION AND SECTION 23-5-101.8 ARE
6 REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2007, ONLY IF SECTION 23-5-101.8 DOES
7 NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE PRIOR TO SAID DATE PURSUANT TO SECTION 9 OF
8 SENATE BILL 04-252 ENACTED DURING THE SECOND REGULAR SESSION OF
9 THE SIXTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
10

11 **SECTION 4.** 23-5-103 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, as
12 amended by Senate Bill 04-189, enacted at the Second Regular Session
13 of the Sixty-fourth General Assembly, is amended to read:

14 **23-5-103. Pledge of income.** (1) The governing board of any one
15 or more state educational institutions, including, but not limited to, the
16 state colleges under the control and operation of their respective boards
17 of trustees, that enters into such a contract for the advancement of
18 moneys is authorized, in connection with or as a part of such contract, to
19 pledge the net income derived or to be derived from such land or facilities
20 so constructed, acquired, and equipped as security for the repayment of
21 the moneys advanced therefor, together with interest thereon, and for the
22 establishment and maintenance of reserves in connection therewith; and,
23 for the same purpose, any such governing board is also authorized,
24 subject to the limitations specified in section 23-1-123 (5), to pledge the
25 net income derived or to be derived from other facilities that are included
26 in a designated enterprise or, if not included, other facilities that are not
27 acquired and not to be acquired with moneys appropriated to the
28 institution by the state of Colorado, and to pledge the net income, fees,
29 and revenues derived from such sources, if unpledged, or, if pledged, the
30 net income, fees, and revenues currently in excess of the amount required
31 to meet principal, interest, and reserve requirements in connection with
32 outstanding obligations to which such net income, fees, and revenues
33 have theretofore been pledged. ~~If the contract for the advancement of
34 moneys is entered into by the university of Colorado on behalf of a
35 designated enterprise auxiliary facility that is associated with the
36 university of Colorado, the board of regents is authorized to pledge only
37 the net income, including fees and revenues derived or to be derived from
38 the designated enterprise auxiliary facility and any other designated
39 enterprise auxiliary facilities.~~ A GOVERNING BOARD OF AN INSTITUTION
40 OR GROUP OF INSTITUTIONS DESIGNATED AS AN ENTERPRISE PURSUANT TO
41 SECTION 23-5-101.7 THAT HAS ENTERED INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE
42 ADVANCEMENT OF MONEY ON BEHALF OF SUCH AN INSTITUTION OR GROUP
43 OF INSTITUTIONS MAY PLEDGE UP TO TEN PERCENT OF TUITION REVENUES
44 OF SUCH AN ENTERPRISE, EXCEPT FOR GENERAL FUND MONEYS
45 APPROPRIATED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, AND ALL OR A PORTION OF A
46 FACILITY CONSTRUCTION FEE THAT MAY BE IMPOSED AS SECURITY FOR THE
47 REPAYMENT OF THE MONEYS ADVANCED PURSUANT TO SAID CONTRACT.
48 THE PLEDGE OF TUITION REVENUES OR THE IMPOSITION OF A FACILITY
49 CONSTRUCTION FEE SHALL INCLUDE A PROCESS FOR STUDENT INPUT
50 CONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 23-1-123.".
