38 This Report Amends the Rerevised Bill.

39
40 To the President of the Senate and the
41 Speaker of the House of Representatives:

42
43 Your first conference committee appointed on SB04-216,

1 concerning limitations on the use of credit information for the purposes
 2 of personal lines of property and casualty insurance rating, and, in
 3 connection therewith, substantially adopting the provisions of the
 4 National Conference of Insurance Legislators model for uses of credit
 5 information for personal lines of property and casualty insurance, has met
 6 and reports that it has agreed upon the following:

7
 8 That the Senate accede to the House amendments made to the bill,
 9 as the amendments appear in the rerevised bill, with the following
 10 changes:

11
 12 Amend rerevised bill, page 10, strike lines 24 through 27.

13
 14 Strike page 11 and substitute the following:

15 **"SECTION 2. Effective date - applicability.** (1) This act shall
 16 take effect January 1, 2005.

17
 18 (2) However, if a referendum petition is filed against this act or
 19 an item, section, or part of this act during the 90-day period after final
 20 adjournment of the general assembly that is allowed for submitting a
 21 referendum petition pursuant to article V, section 1 (3) of the state
 22 constitution, then the act, item, section, or part, shall not take effect
 23 unless approved by the people at a biennial regular general election and
 24 shall take effect on the date specified in subsection (1) or on the date of
 25 the official declaration of the vote thereon by proclamation of the
 26 governor, whichever is later.

27
 28 (3) The provisions of this act shall apply to personal lines of
 29 property and casualty insurance policies issued or renewed on or after the
 30 applicable effective date of this act."

1 Colorado an amendment to section 2 of article XXI of the
 2 constitution of the state of Colorado, concerning elections
 3 to recall state elected officials, and, in connection
 4 therewith, providing for the deadlines regarding recall
 5 petitions and hearings to be set in statute rather than in the
 6 constitution and stating that a recall election shall be held
 7 as part of a general election if a general election will be
 8 held between fifty and ninety days after the time for filing
 9 a protest has passed and all protests have been finally
 10 decided.
