31 Strike everything below the enacting clause and substitute the following:

33 "SECTION 1. Part 7 of article 2 of title 26, Colorado Revised
34 Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to
35 read:
36

37 **26-2-714.5. Adjusted work participation rate - notification -**
38 **county authorization - vocational education.** (1) AS USED IN THIS
39 SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES, "FEDERAL CREDIT"
40 MEANS THE CASELOAD REDUCTION CREDIT AS CALCULATED PURSUANT TO
41 45 C.F.R. SECTION 261.40, OR ANY EMPLOYMENT CREDIT, CASELOAD
42 REDUCTION CREDIT, OR OTHER CREDIT AGAINST SUCH RATE FOR A FISCAL
43 YEAR THAT MAY BE SUBSEQUENTLY ADOPTED BY THE FEDERAL
44 GOVERNMENT.
45

46 (2) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOTIFY EACH COUNTY, WITHIN
47 THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE BEGINNING OF THE STATE FISCAL YEAR, OF THE
48 STATE DEPARTMENT'S PROJECTION REGARDING THE ADJUSTED RATE THAT
49 THE STATE MUST ATTAIN FOR THE FISCAL YEAR IN ORDER TO BE IN
50 COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS, BASED ON THE STATE'S
51 ESTIMATE OF THE FEDERAL CREDIT THE STATE ANTICIPATES QUALIFYING TO
52 RECEIVE. THIS ADJUSTED RATE SHALL BE THE COUNTY'S ADJUSTED WORK
53 PARTICIPATION RATE FOR THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR.
54

55 (3) EACH COUNTY IS AUTHORIZED TO PLACE PARTICIPANTS IN
56 VOCATIONAL EDUCATION, AS THAT TERM IS DEFINED BY RULE OF THE

1 STATE BOARD, FOR LONGER THAN TWELVE MONTHS IN ORDER TO MEET
2 CRITICAL SKILLS SHORTAGES IN THE LABOR MARKET, PROVIDED THAT THE
3 PERCENTAGE OF PARTICIPANTS ALLOWED TO SATISFY PROGRAM
4 REQUIREMENTS THROUGH VOCATIONAL EDUCATION OF LONGER THAN
5 TWELVE MONTHS IN A COUNTY SHALL NOT EXCEED SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT
6 OF THE STATE'S ESTIMATE OF THE FEDERAL CREDIT.

7
8 (4) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED BY
9 THE STATE DEPARTMENT CONSISTENT WITH THE REQUIREMENT OF SECTION
10 26-2-715 (1) (a) (III).

12 (5) THE STATE DEPARTMENT MAY SUSPEND A COUNTY'S ABILITY TO
13 PLACE PARTICIPANTS IN VOCATIONAL EDUCATION FOR LONGER THAN
14 TWELVE MONTHS IF THE STATE DEPARTMENT CERTIFIES THAT ALLOWING
15 VOCATIONAL EDUCATION TO COUNT TOWARD A WORKS PARTICIPANT'S
16 REQUIRED WORK ACTIVITIES WOULD AFFECT THE STATE'S ABILITY TO MEET
17 FEDERAL WORK PARTICIPATION RATES.

19 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
20 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
21 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety."

43 RATE FOR MEMBERS OF THE MEWA BY MORE THAN THE AMOUNTS SET
44 FORTH IN THE FOLLOWING SCHEDULE:

46 (A) ON AND AFTER SEPTEMBER 1, 2003, UNTIL SEPTEMBER 29,
47 2004, DECREASES MORE THAN FIFTEEN PERCENT FROM THE AVERAGE RATE
48 FOR MEMBERS OF THE MEWA;

50 (B) ON AND AFTER SEPTEMBER 30, 2004, INCREASES MORE THAN
51 TEN PERCENT FROM OR DECREASES MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE PERCENT
52 FROM THE AVERAGE RATE FOR MEMBERS OF THE MEWA.

54 (II) ANY ADJUSTMENTS MADE PURSUANT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF
55 THIS PARAGRAPH (c) SHALL BE APPLIED UNIFORMLY TO THE RATES
56 CHARGED FOR ALL INDIVIDUALS UNDER THE MEWA POLICY."
