**HCR04-1016** by Representative(s) Spradley; also Senator(s) Hillman--Submitting to the registered electors of the state of Colorado amendments to section 17 of article IX and section 20 of article X of the constitution of the state of Colorado, concerning a modification of constitutional restrictions affecting the ability of the general assembly to make adjustments to state spending in response to changing levels of state revenues, and, in connection therewith, restricting the growth in the statewide base per pupil funding for the 2005-06 and 2006-07 state fiscal years to the rate of inflation plus one additional percentage point; reducing by seventy-five million dollars the amount of moneys required to be spent on public school funding in the 2005-06 and 2006-07 state fiscal years; for the 2005-06 state fiscal year, requiring the state to retain up to one hundred fifty million dollars of excess state revenues; for the 2006-07 state fiscal year, requiring the state to retain up to the sum of one hundred fifty million dollars of

excess state revenues and one hundred fifty million dollars

of such revenues as adjusted for specified factors; and, for

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the 2007-08 and all succeeding state fiscal years, requiring the state to retain up to the amount of excess state revenues retained in the 2006-07 state fiscal year as adjusted for specified factors.
