1 *Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly of*
2 *the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:*

3 **SECTION 1.** At the next election at which such question may be
4 submitted, there shall be submitted to the registered electors of the state
5 of Colorado, for their approval or rejection, the following amendment to
6 the constitution of the state of Colorado, to wit:

8 Section 5 of article XVII of the constitution of the state of
9 Colorado is amended to read:

10 **Section 5. Exemption in time of peace.** No person having
11 conscientious scruples against bearing arms shall be compelled to do
12 militia duty in time of peace. ~~provided, such person shall pay an~~
13 ~~equivalent for such exemption.~~

14 ██████████
15 Section 7 of article XX of the constitution of the state of Colorado
16 is amended to read:

17 **Section 7. City and county of Denver single school district -**
18 **consolidations.** The city and county of Denver shall alone always
19 constitute one school district, to be known as District No. 1, but its
20 conduct, affairs and business shall be in the hands of a board of education
21 consisting of such numbers, elected in such manner as the general school

1 laws of the state shall provide. ~~and until the first election under said laws~~
2 ~~of a full board of education which shall be had at the first election held~~
3 ~~after the adoption of this amendment, all the directors of school district~~
4 ~~No. 1, and the respective presidents of the school boards of school~~
5 ~~districts Nos. 2, 7, 17 and 21, at the time this amendment takes effect,~~
6 ~~shall act as such board of education, and all districts or special charters~~
7 ~~now existing are hereby abolished.~~

8 The said board of education shall perform all the acts and duties
9 required to be performed for said district by the general laws of the state.
10 Except as inconsistent with this amendment, the general school laws of
11 the state shall, unless the context evinces a contrary intent, be held to
12 extend and apply to the said "District No. 1".

13 Upon the annexation of any contiguous municipality which shall
14 include a school district or districts or any part of a district, said school
15 district or districts or part shall be merged in said "District No. 1", which
16 shall then own all the property thereof, real and personal, located within
17 the boundaries of such annexed municipality, and shall assume and pay
18 all the bonds, obligations and indebtedness of each of the said included
19 school districts, and a proper proportion of those of partially included
20 districts.

21 Provided, however, that the indebtedness, both principal and
22 interest, which any school district may be under at the time when it
23 becomes a part, by this amendment or by annexation, of said "District No.
24 1", shall be paid by said school district so owing the same by a special tax
25 to be fixed and certified by the board of education to the council which
26 shall levy the same upon the property within the boundaries of such
27 district, respectively, as the same existed at the time such district becomes
28 a part of said "District No. 1", and in case of partially included districts

1 such tax shall be equitably apportioned upon the several parts thereof.

2 Section 2 (a), (b), (c), and (e) of article XXIV of the constitution
3 of the state of Colorado are amended to read:

4 **Section 2. Moneys allocated to fund.** There is hereby set aside,
5 allocated and allotted to the old age pension fund sums and money as
6 follows:

7 (a) ~~Beginning January 1, 1957,~~ Eighty-five percent of all net
8 revenue accrued or accruing, received or receivable from any and all
9 excise taxes now or hereafter levied upon sales at retail, or any other
10 purchase transaction; together with eighty-five percent of the net revenue
11 derived from any excise taxes now or hereafter levied upon the storage,
12 use, or consumption of any commodity or product; together with
13 eighty-five percent of all license fees imposed by ~~the provisions of~~
14 ~~sections 138-6-1 to 138-6-42, both inclusive,~~ of ARTICLE 26 OF TITLE 39,
15 Colorado Revised Statutes, ~~1953,~~ and amendments thereto; provided,
16 however, that no part of the revenue derived from excise taxes now or
17 hereafter levied, for highway purposes, upon gasoline or other motor fuel,
18 shall be made a part of said old age pension fund.

19 (b) ~~Beginning January 1, 1957,~~ Eighty-five percent of all net
20 revenue accrued or accruing, received or receivable from taxes of
21 whatever kind upon all malt, vinous, or spirituous liquor, both
22 intoxicating and non-intoxicating, and license fees connected therewith.

23 (c) ~~All unexpended money in any fund of the state of Colorado,~~
24 ~~or political subdivision thereof, as of January 1, 1957, which prior to said~~
25 ~~date has been allocated to the payment of an old age pension.~~

26 (e) ~~All inheritance taxes and incorporation fees appropriated under~~
27 ~~101-2-2 to 101-2-4, both inclusive, Colorado Revised Statutes 1953, for~~
28 ~~old age pensions.~~

1 Section 3 of article XXIV of the constitution of the state of
2 Colorado is amended to read:

3 **Section 3. Persons entitled to receive pensions.** ~~From and after~~
4 ~~January 1, 1957,~~ Every citizen of the United States who has been a
5 resident of the state of Colorado for such period as the general assembly
6 may determine, who has attained the age of sixty years or more, and who
7 qualifies under the laws of Colorado to receive a pension, shall be entitled
8 to receive the same; provided, however, that no person otherwise
9 qualified shall be denied a pension by reason of the fact that ~~he~~ THE
10 PERSON is the owner of real estate occupied by ~~him~~ THE PERSON as a
11 residence; nor for the reason that relatives may be financially able to
12 contribute to ~~his~~ THE PERSON'S support and maintenance; nor shall any
13 person be denied a pension for the reason that ~~he~~ THE PERSON owns
14 personal property which by law is exempt from execution or attachment;
15 nor shall any person be required, in order to receive a pension, to repay,
16 or promise to repay, the state of Colorado any money paid to ~~him~~ THE
17 PERSON as an old age pension.


18 Section 5 of article XXIV of the constitution of the state of
19 Colorado is amended to read:

20 **Section 5. Revenues for old age pension fund continued.** The
21 excise tax on sales at retail, together with all license fees levied by ~~the~~
22 ~~provisions of sections 138-6-1 to 138-6-42, both inclusive~~ ARTICLE 26 OF
23 TITLE 39, Colorado Revised Statutes, ~~1953,~~ and amendments thereto, are
24 hereby continued in full force and effect beyond the date on which said
25 taxes and license fees would otherwise expire, and shall continue until
26 repealed or amended; provided, however, that no law providing revenue
27 for the old age pension fund shall be repealed, nor shall any such law be
28 amended so as to reduce the revenue provided for the old age pension

1 fund, except in the event that at the time of such repeal or amendment,
2 revenue is provided for the old age pension fund in an amount at least
3 equal to that provided by the measure amended or repealed during the
4 calendar year immediately preceding the proposed amendment or repeal.

5 Section 9 of article XXIV of the constitution of the state of
6 Colorado is repealed as follows:

7 **Section 9. Effective date.** ~~This article shall be in force and effect~~
8 ~~from and after January 1, 1957.~~

9 
10 **SECTION 2.** Each elector voting at said election and desirous of
11 voting for or against said amendment shall cast a vote as provided by law
12 either "Yes" or "No" on the proposition: "AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES
13 XVII, XX, AND XXIV OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF
14 COLORADO, CONCERNING THE ELIMINATION OF OBSOLETE PROVISIONS OF
15 THE STATE CONSTITUTION."

16 **SECTION 3.** The votes cast for the adoption or rejection of said
17 amendment shall be canvassed and the result determined in the manner
18 provided by law for the canvassing of votes for representatives in
19 Congress, and if a majority of the electors voting on the question shall
20 have voted "Yes", the said amendment shall become a part of the state
21 constitution.
