SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 06-002

101 SUBMITTING TO THE REGISTERED ELECTORS OF THE STATE OF  
102 COLORADO AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES XVIII, XX, AND XXIV  
103 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO,  
104 CONCERNING THE ELIMINATION OF OBSOLETE PROVISIONS OF  
105 THE STATE CONSTITUTION.

Resolution Summary

Submits to voters of the state amendments eliminating obsolete provisions of the state constitution concerning:

The requirement that conscientious objectors pay for their exemption from militia duty;

Deadlines to create the principal departments of state

government and to implement the constitutional provisions on limited gaming and medical marijuana; References to outdated requirements related to the city and county of Denver single school district; References to dates and outdated statutory provisions regarding the old age pension fund; and The severability clause for provisions concerning nuclear detonations.

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1           *Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly of*  
2           *the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:*

3           **SECTION 1.** At the next election at which such question may be  
4 submitted, there shall be submitted to the registered electors of the state  
5 of Colorado, for their approval or rejection, the following amendment to  
6 the constitution of the state of Colorado, to wit:

7             
8           Section 9 (1) and (2) of article XVIII of the constitution of the  
9 state of Colorado are amended to read:

10           **Section 9. Limited gaming permitted.** (1) Any provisions of  
11 section 2 of this article XVIII or any other provisions of this constitution  
12 to the contrary notwithstanding, limited gaming in the City of Central, the  
13 City of Black Hawk, and the City of Cripple Creek shall be lawful. ~~as of~~  
14 ~~October 1, 1991.~~

15           (2) The administration and regulation of this section 9 shall be  
16 under an appointed limited gaming control commission, referred to in this  
17 section 9 as the commission; said commission to be created under such  
18 official or department of government of the state of Colorado as the  
19 general assembly shall provide. ~~by May 1, 1991.~~ Such official or the  
20 director of the department of government shall appoint the commission.  
21 ~~by July 1, 1991.~~ The commission shall promulgate all necessary rules and

1 regulations relating to the licensing of limited gaming by ~~October 1, 1991,~~  
2 in the manner authorized by statute for the promulgation of administrative  
3 rules and regulations. Such rules and regulations shall include the  
4 necessary defining of terms that are not otherwise defined.

5 Section 14 (7) and the introductory portion to section 14 (8) of  
6 article XVIII of the constitution of the state of Colorado are amended to  
7 read:

8 **Section 14. Medical use of marijuana for persons suffering**  
9 **from debilitating medical conditions.** (7) ~~Not later than March 1,~~  
10 ~~1999,~~ The governor shall designate, by executive order, the state health  
11 agency as defined in ~~paragraph (1) (g)~~ PARAGRAPH (1) (h) of this section.

12 (8) ~~Not later than April 30, 1999,~~ The General Assembly shall  
13 define such terms and enact such legislation as may be necessary for  
14 implementation of this section, as well as determine and enact criminal  
15 penalties for:

16 Section 7 of article XX of the constitution of the state of Colorado  
17 is amended to read:

18 **Section 7. City and county of Denver single school district -**  
19 **consolidations.** The city and county of Denver shall alone always  
20 constitute one school district, to be known as District No. 1, but its  
21 conduct, affairs and business shall be in the hands of a board of education  
22 consisting of such numbers, elected in such manner as the general school  
23 laws of the state shall provide. ~~and until the first election under said laws~~  
24 ~~of a full board of education which shall be had at the first election held~~  
25 ~~after the adoption of this amendment, all the directors of school district~~  
26 ~~No. 1, and the respective presidents of the school boards of school~~  
27 ~~districts Nos. 2, 7, 17 and 21, at the time this amendment takes effect,~~  
28 ~~shall act as such board of education, and all districts or special charters~~

1 ~~now existing are hereby abolished.~~

2           The said board of education shall perform all the acts and duties  
3 required to be performed for said district by the general laws of the state.  
4 Except as inconsistent with this amendment, the general school laws of  
5 the state shall, unless the context evinces a contrary intent, be held to  
6 extend and apply to the said "District No. 1".

7           Upon the annexation of any contiguous municipality which shall  
8 include a school district or districts or any part of a district, said school  
9 district or districts or part shall be merged in said "District No. 1", which  
10 shall then own all the property thereof, real and personal, located within  
11 the boundaries of such annexed municipality, and shall assume and pay  
12 all the bonds, obligations and indebtedness of each of the said included  
13 school districts, and a proper proportion of those of partially included  
14 districts.

15           Provided, however, that the indebtedness, both principal and  
16 interest, which any school district may be under at the time when it  
17 becomes a part, by this amendment or by annexation, of said "District No.  
18 1", shall be paid by said school district so owing the same by a special tax  
19 to be fixed and certified by the board of education to the council which  
20 shall levy the same upon the property within the boundaries of such  
21 district, respectively, as the same existed at the time such district becomes  
22 a part of said "District No. 1", and in case of partially included districts  
23 such tax shall be equitably apportioned upon the several parts thereof.

24           Section 2 (a), (b), (c), and (e) of article XXIV of the constitution  
25 of the state of Colorado are amended to read:

26           **Section 2. Moneys allocated to fund.** There is hereby set aside,  
27 allocated and allotted to the old age pension fund sums and money as  
28 follows:

1           (a) ~~Beginning January 1, 1957,~~ Eighty-five percent of all net  
2 revenue accrued or accruing, received or receivable from any and all  
3 excise taxes now or hereafter levied upon sales at retail, or any other  
4 purchase transaction; together with eighty-five percent of the net revenue  
5 derived from any excise taxes now or hereafter levied upon the storage,  
6 use, or consumption of any commodity or product; together with  
7 eighty-five percent of all license fees imposed by ~~the provisions of~~  
8 ~~sections 138-6-1 to 138-6-42, both inclusive,~~ of ARTICLE 26 OF TITLE 39,  
9 Colorado Revised Statutes, ~~1953,~~ and amendments thereto; provided,  
10 however, that no part of the revenue derived from excise taxes now or  
11 hereafter levied, for highway purposes, upon gasoline or other motor fuel,  
12 shall be made a part of said old age pension fund.

13           (b) ~~Beginning January 1, 1957,~~ Eighty-five percent of all net  
14 revenue accrued or accruing, received or receivable from taxes of  
15 whatever kind upon all malt, vinous, or spirituous liquor, both  
16 intoxicating and non-intoxicating, and license fees connected therewith.

17           (c) ~~All unexpended money in any fund of the state of Colorado,~~  
18 ~~or political subdivision thereof, as of January 1, 1957, which prior to said~~  
19 ~~date has been allocated to the payment of an old age pension.~~

20           (e) ~~All inheritance taxes and incorporation fees appropriated under~~  
21 ~~101-2-2 to 101-2-4, both inclusive, Colorado Revised Statutes 1953, for~~  
22 ~~old age pensions.~~

23           Section 3 of article XXIV of the constitution of the state of  
24 Colorado is amended to read:

25           **Section 3. Persons entitled to receive pensions.** ~~From and after~~  
26 ~~January 1, 1957,~~ Every citizen of the United States who has been a  
27 resident of the state of Colorado for such period as the general assembly  
28 may determine, who has attained the age of sixty years or more, and who

1 qualifies under the laws of Colorado to receive a pension, shall be entitled  
2 to receive the same; provided, however, that no person otherwise  
3 qualified shall be denied a pension by reason of the fact that ~~he~~ THE  
4 PERSON is the owner of real estate occupied by ~~him~~ THE PERSON as a  
5 residence; nor for the reason that relatives may be financially able to  
6 contribute to ~~his~~ THE PERSON'S support and maintenance; nor shall any  
7 person be denied a pension for the reason that ~~he~~ THE PERSON owns  
8 personal property which by law is exempt from execution or attachment;  
9 nor shall any person be required, in order to receive a pension, to repay,  
10 or promise to repay, the state of Colorado any money paid to ~~him~~ THE  
11 PERSON as an old age pension.

12 Section 5 of article XXIV of the constitution of the state of  
13 Colorado is amended to read:

14 **Section 5. Revenues for old age pension fund continued.** The  
15 excise tax on sales at retail, together with all license fees levied by ~~the~~  
16 ~~provisions of sections 138-6-1 to 138-6-42, both inclusive~~ ARTICLE 26 OF  
17 TITLE 39, Colorado Revised Statutes, 1953, and amendments thereto, are  
18 hereby continued in full force and effect beyond the date on which said  
19 taxes and license fees would otherwise expire, and shall continue until  
20 repealed or amended; provided, however, that no law providing revenue  
21 for the old age pension fund shall be repealed, nor shall any such law be  
22 amended so as to reduce the revenue provided for the old age pension  
23 fund, except in the event that at the time of such repeal or amendment,  
24 revenue is provided for the old age pension fund in an amount at least  
25 equal to that provided by the measure amended or repealed during the  
26 calendar year immediately preceding the proposed amendment or repeal.

27 Section 9 of article XXIV of the constitution of the state of  
28 Colorado is repealed as follows:

1           **Section 9. Effective date.** ~~This article shall be in force and effect~~  
2 ~~from and after January 1, 1957.~~

3

4           **SECTION 2.** Each elector voting at said election and desirous of  
5 voting for or against said amendment shall cast a vote as provided by law  
6 either "Yes" or "No" on the proposition: "AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES  
7 XVIII, XX, AND XXIV OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF  
8 COLORADO, CONCERNING THE ELIMINATION OF OBSOLETE PROVISIONS OF  
9 THE STATE CONSTITUTION."

10           **SECTION 3.** The votes cast for the adoption or rejection of said  
11 amendment shall be canvassed and the result determined in the manner  
12 provided by law for the canvassing of votes for representatives in  
13 Congress, and if a majority of the electors voting on the question shall  
14 have voted "Yes", the said amendment shall become a part of the state  
15 constitution.
