**Summary of Legislation**

This bill refers to the voters a measure directing the state Attorney General to initiate a lawsuit to demand the enforcement of immigration laws at the federal level.

**State Expenditures**

The bill is assessed at having a conditional fiscal impact contingent upon voter approval at the 2006 general election. Should the measure be approved, the fiscal note assumes that any costs in the Attorney General's Office to proceed with the lawsuit will be addressed through the annual budget process. No costs are identified at this time.
