23

24 I am returning to the Colorado House of Representatives House Bill 10-1101,
25 "Concerning the registration of a vehicle used for agricultural production." I
26 vetoed this bill as of 2:54 p.m. today, and this letter sets forth my reasons for
27 doing so.
28

29 As someone who grew up on a farm, I strongly value the work of Colorado's
30 farmers and ranchers. The agricultural industry contributes not only to the
31 economic well-being of Colorado--which is more important now than ever
32 before--but also the moral fiber and long history of our state.
33

34 Since I took office, I have remained committed to ensuring that Colorado's
35 farmers and ranchers are able to continue working their land and that they have
36 new opportunities to expand. I have worked hard to aid rural communities in
37 times of distress--such as during the blizzards early on in my administration,
38 and other hardships such as drought and freezing temperatures that have
39 impacted many food crops across the state.
40

41 I have also made it a top priority to build a New Energy Economy here in
42 Colorado, so that our farmers and ranchers can diversify their investments and
43 our rural communities can benefit from the jobs that renewable energy projects
44 bring to the state. Thanks to the help of many of our farming and ranching
45 organizations, I have signed or fifty pieces of New Energy Economy legislation.
46 Moreover, I made sure to preserve the majority of the existing tax credits for
47 agriculture within my budget balancing package--despite the great economic
48 challenges in the state.
49

50 I feel strongly that we need to preserve the integrity of our existing incentive
51 programs for our agricultural communities. The farm truck license plate
52 program is one program that recognizes farmers' and ranchers' important
53 contributions to the state. Potential abuse of any incentives can detract from the
54 long-term viability of these programs--and I believe that this program is far too
55 important to our farmers and ranchers to risk undermining the existing
56 safeguards.

1
2 Under current law, individuals who wish to register a vehicle as a farm truck
3 must certify on a Colorado Department of Revenue form, under penalty of
4 perjury, that the vehicle will be used for agricultural purposes. In addition,
5 issuers of farm truck license plates may also require that an individual
6 registering a farm truck provide a federal form 1040 F as proof of eligibility.
7 These requirements safeguard the integrity of the farm truck license plate
8 program by ensuring that only eligible members of the agricultural community
9 receive a farm truck license plate.

10
11 House Bill 10-1101 prohibits issuers of farm truck license plate from requiring
12 registrants to show proof of eligibility for those agricultural license plates. The
13 current system has worked well for decades, and I am unconvinced that there
14 is a compelling need for a change. Indeed, by removing the program's existing
15 safeguards, House Bill 10-1101 would expose the agricultural license program
16 to increased fraud in the form of illegitimate farm plate vehicle registrations and
17 non-agricultural vehicles receiving this program's benefit. In turn, an increase
18 in vehicles illegitimately registered with farm plates would adversely impact
19 vehicle registration revenues and reduce the number of vehicles required to
20 submit to an emissions test.

21
22 In order to ensure the continued integrity of the farm truck license plate
23 program and to protect the revenue and environment of the state of Colorado,
24 the current requirements for registering a vehicle as a farm truck should remain
25 unchanged.

26
27 Accordingly, I have vetoed this bill.
