12 PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING SPACE IN SCHOOL DISTRICT FACILITIES THAT
13 TAKES INTO ACCOUNT PARENT DEMAND, SCHOOL PERFORMANCE, AND
14 BUILDING QUALITY; AND

15
16 (C) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT ACCURATELY ASSESSES COSTS FOR
17 CHARTER SCHOOLS TO OCCUPY SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPERTY.

18
19 (III) IF A SCHOOL DISTRICT CLAIMS TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS
20 SPECIFIED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (b.5) AND THE
21 CHARTER SCHOOL DISAGREES, THE CHARTER SCHOOL MAY APPEAL THE
22 SCHOOL DISTRICT'S CLAIM TO THE STATE BOARD BY FILING A WRITTEN
23 REQUEST FOR REVIEW WITH THE STATE BOARD AND SUBMITTING A COPY
24 OF THE REQUEST TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE CHARTER SCHOOL AND
25 THE SCHOOL DISTRICT MAY SUBMIT TO THE STATE BOARD WRITTEN
26 EXPLANATIONS OF THEIR RESPECTIVE POSITIONS. THE STATE BOARD
27 SHALL DECIDE WHETHER THE SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS
28 SPECIFIED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (b.5) AT ITS NEXT
29 REGULARLY SCHEDULED MEETING THAT OCCURS AT LEAST THIRTY DAYS
30 AFTER THE DATE ON WHICH IT RECEIVES THE REQUEST FOR REVIEW. THE
31 STATE BOARD'S DECISION SHALL BE FINAL AND NOT SUBJECT TO APPEAL."
