IN THE CASE OF CIRCUMSTANCES WARRANTING AN EMERGENCY INJUNCTIVE PROCEEDING, MAILING OF THE ORDER IN A CERTIFIED LETTER TO THE WELL OWNER OR OPERATOR, TOGETHER WITH THE POSTING OF A WRITTEN ORDER IN PLAIN SIGHT AT THE WELL HEAD, IS SUFFICIENT NOTICE OF THE ORDER OF THE GROUND WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT. THE ORDER TO THE WELL OWNER OR OPERATOR BECOMES EFFECTIVE ON THE DATE OF POSTING IN THE CASE OF POSTING AT THE WELL HEAD OR THREE DAYS AFTER THE CERTIFIED LETTER IS PLACED IN THE UNITED STATES MAIL IN THE CASE OF THE CERTIFIED LETTER. EXCEPT IN THE CASE OF CIRCUMSTANCES WARRANTING AN EMERGENCY INJUNCTIVE PROCEEDING, A GROUND WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT SHALL ALLOW AN ALLEGED VIOLATOR NOT LESS THAN SEVEN DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ORDER TO CURE AN ALLEGED VIOLATION BEFORE FILING SUIT IN DISTRICT COURT."
