THE 39 INFORMATION MUST, AT A MINIMUM, INFORM VICTIMS OF THE MEDICAL 40 FACILITY WITH WHICH THE INSTITUTION HAS A MEMORANDUM OF 41 UNDERSTANDING OR FORMALIZED ARRANGEMENT; THE METHODS OF 42 TRANSPORTATION AVAILABLE TO GET TO THE FACILITY, INCLUDING PUBLIC 43 TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS; AND INFORM VICTIMS THAT HAVING A 44 MEDICAL FORENSIC EXAMINATION DOES NOT REQUIRE THEM, AT ANY TIME, 45 TO PARTICIPATE WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT INVESTIGATION OR ANY 46 CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESPONSE.

(I) A PLAN TO ENSURE THAT CAMPUS HEALTH CENTER STAFF IS

AT A 3 MINIMUM, TRAINING SHOULD INCLUDE CONTENT IN THE FOLLOWING 4 AREAS: 5 (A) AN OVERVIEW OF MEDICAL FORENSIC EXAMS FOR THE PURPOSE 6 OF ENABLING CAMPUS HEALTH STAFF TO ANSWER A VICTIM'S QUESTIONS 7 ABOUT MEDICAL FORENSIC EXAMS; 8 (B) TRAUMA RESPONSE; 9 (C) VICTIM DYNAMICS; 10 (D) SHORT-TERM AND LONG-TERM HEALTH IMPACT OF SEXUAL 11 ASSAULT; (E) VICTIM COMPENSATION ELIGIBILITY AS DESCRIBED IN ARTICLE 12 13 4.1 OF TITLE 24, C.R.S.; AND 14 (F) SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIM EMERGENCY PAYMENT PROGRAM 15 ELIGIBILITY AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 18-3-407.7, C.R.S. 16 (II) A REFERRAL PLAN TO CONNECT A STUDENT WHO IS A VICTIM 17 TO THE APPROPRIATE VICTIM ADVOCATES.
