(b) A CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION FOR RETAILERS OR SUPPLIERS WHO ADVERTISE, SELL, INSTALL, OR CONTRACT FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A WATER CONDITIONING APPLIANCE CONNECTED TO A POTABLE WATER SYSTEM WITH A PIPE THAT IS TWO INCHES OR LESS NOMINAL DIAMETER.".
