- Sales Tax proposal equates to an additional \$1.30 per carton
- Taking the percentage of taxes and fees of the total retail consumer price per carton to 54%
- Fiscal Year 2007 State of Colorado collected over \$204,000,000.00 in State Cigarette Excise Tax
- MSA Payments to the State of Colorado have averaged nearly \$100,000,000.00 per year over the last 8 plus years
- The Congressional Budget Office states that the new tax already in effect (\$6.20 per carton for SCHIP) will negatively impact the revenues for the State of Colorado between \$21.8 and \$24.5 million per year
- The average Cigarette Smoker makes less than \$40,000.00 per year
- Is it prudent to hang another tax on a declining revenue source that is already blatantly over taxed?
