After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

SB09-163 be amended as follows:

1 Amend reengrossed bill, page 99, line 22, strike "STATE;" and substitute  
 2 "STATE AND THE INFORMATION SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS  
 3 SECTION;".

4 Page 100, after line 6, insert the following:

5 "(3) IN ADDITION TO ANY INFORMATION SPECIFIED BY RULE OF THE  
 6 STATE BOARD, EACH SCHOOL PERFORMANCE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE THE  
 7 FOLLOWING INFORMATION CONCERNING THE OPERATIONS, ENVIRONMENT,  
 8 AND FUNDING OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF THE  
 9 REPORT:

10 (a) THE NAME OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL, THE TYPE OF SCHOOL  
 11 PROGRAM PROVIDED AT THE PUBLIC SCHOOL, AND THE SCHOOL YEAR FOR  
 12 WHICH THE INFORMATION IN THE PERFORMANCE REPORT IS PROVIDED.  
 13 THE PERFORMANCE REPORT SHALL ALSO INCLUDE THE PUBLIC SCHOOL'S  
 14 STREET ADDRESS, TELEPHONE NUMBER, AND EMAIL ADDRESS, AND, IF ONE  
 15 EXISTS, THE WEB SITE ADDRESS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR THE PUBLIC  
 16 SCHOOL.

17 (b) INFORMATION CONCERNING THE PERCENTAGES OF STUDENTS  
 18 WHO ARE NOT TESTED OR WHOSE SCORES ARE NOT INCLUDED IN  
 19 DETERMINING ATTAINMENT OF THE PERFORMANCE INDICATORS;

20 (c) AS DESCRIBED IN STATE BOARD RULE, THE OCCURRENCE OF  
 21 EACH OF THE FOLLOWING TYPES OF INCIDENTS, EXPRESSED AS A NUMBER

7 (III) FOR A DISTRICT CHARTER SCHOOL OR AN INSTITUTE CHARTER  
8 SCHOOL:

9 (A) THE TOTAL REVENUE RECEIVED BY THE CHARTER SCHOOL AND  
10 THE PERCENTAGE OF THE CHARTER SCHOOL'S REVENUE RECEIVED FROM  
11 SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX COLLECTIONS, IF ANY, AND FROM STATE  
12 EQUALIZATION PAYMENTS;

13 (B) THE CHARTER SCHOOL'S TOTAL PER PUPIL REVENUE,  
14 CALCULATED AS THE CHARTER SCHOOL'S TOTAL REVENUE FOR THE

1 (I) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S TOTAL OUTSTANDING BONDED DEBT;

2 (II) THE AVERAGE ANNUAL PERCENTAGE INTEREST RATE ON THE  
3 SCHOOL DISTRICT'S DEBT;

4 (III) THE AMOUNT RAISED FROM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S MOST  
5 RECENT BOND ISSUE; AND

6 (IV) THE AMOUNT SPENT BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT ON NEW  
7 SCHOOL BUILDINGS DURING THE PRECEDING TWO YEARS;

8 (j) FOR A PUBLIC SCHOOL OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT, INFORMATION  
9 CONCERNING RECENT ELECTIONS HELD IN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT DEALING  
10 WITH SECTION 20 OF ARTICLE X OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION, MILL  
11 LEVIES, OR BONDING PROPOSALS, AND AN EXPLANATION FOR THE  
12 MEASURES.

13 (4) EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND THE  
14 INSTITUTE SHALL REPORT ACCURATELY THE DATA REQUIRED TO PRODUCE  
15 A PERFORMANCE REPORT. THE STATE BOARD SHALL SEEK TO MINIMIZE  
16 AND ELIMINATE THE DUPLICATION OF DATA REPORTING REQUIRED UNDER  
17 THIS SECTION AND DATA REPORTING REQUIRED BY OTHER STATE OR  
18 FEDERAL STATUTES OR RULES SO THAT SCHOOL DISTRICTS, INSTITUTE  
19 CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND THE INSTITUTE MAY SATISFY THE MULTIPLE  
20 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS WITHIN A SINGLE REPORTING FRAMEWORK.

21 (5) PRIOR TO THE PUBLICATION OF THE PERFORMANCE REPORTS,  
22 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

23 (a) ALLOW EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, EACH CHARTER SCHOOL, AND  
24 THE INSTITUTE A REASONABLE PERIOD OF TIME TO REVIEW THE SCHOOL  
25 DISTRICT'S, THE CHARTER SCHOOL'S, OR THE INSTITUTE'S INFORMATION AS  
26 IT WILL APPEAR ON THE SCHOOL PERFORMANCE REPORTS; AND

27 (b) CORRECT ANY ERRORS OR MISINFORMATION IDENTIFIED BY THE  
28 SCHOOL DISTRICT, CHARTER SCHOOL, OR INSTITUTE.

29 (6) THE SCHOOL PERFORMANCE REPORT PRODUCED FOR EACH  
30 PUBLIC SCHOOL PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION MAY CONTAIN INTERNET  
31 LINKS THROUGH WHICH A PERSON MAY ACCESS ADDITIONAL INFORMATION  
32 NOT PROVIDED IN DETAIL IN THE REPORT. THE STATE BOARD MAY MAKE

- 1 CHANGES IN THE FORMAT OR THE CONTENTS OF THE PERFORMANCE
- 2 REPORTS PREPARED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION."
