Dear Representative Rice and Senator Gibbs:

American Council of Engineering Companies of Colorado (ACEC/CO) applauds your efforts to find new transportation funding streams to address our current and future infrastructure needs. ACEC/CO endorses the "FASTER" legislation — SB09 -108, and will encourage our membership to support it. We believe this legislation will stimulate the economy, invest in critical bridge and road safety projects, and establish a future funding system.

Infrastructure spending creates 37,000 jobs per \$1 billion spent. We support SB09 -108 funding that dedicates \$100 million annually for bridges, and \$160 million annually that will be allocated to state, county and city roadway safety projects. This type of spending benefits all Coloradoans and the economic well-being of our state since we will have something to show for our dollars.

Although over \$4 billion is needed to meet all of the state's infrastructure needs, this legislation is a good start to meet those needs. We support the future funding streams that SB09 -108 provides by establishing a mileage-based revenue pilot program, encouraging private-public partnerships and tolling existing highways. We are willing to help you and your colleagues promote the need for these new funding streams to the general public.
