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
- o \$65 billion shortfall statewide
- 116 → 126 Structurally deficient bridges
- 40% ★ 47% roads in poor condition
- 1:5 miles to state highway needs complete reconstruction
- o 1.5 million more people by 2020
- o Population over 65 will double by 2025
- o Truck traffic will double by 2030

Quiet Crisis Getting Louder

- o Federal funding \$8 billion bailout
- Price per barrel\$147/barrel in June 2008\$35/barrel in January 2009
- Auto industry move toward more fuel efficient vehicles
- o Economic Stimulus





Investment Categories

\$1.5 Billion Annual Funding Threshold – Preferred Alternative

	Investment Allocation	
Investment Category	Funding Level	Service Level Outcome
Surface Treatment	\$222 million	Raise from C to B
Bridge	\$156 million	Maintain at B
Maintenance Levels of Service	\$82 million	Raise from C to B
Shoulders	\$78 million	Raise from F to D
Mobility - \$562 million total		
 Strategic Projects 	\$56 million	Accelerate funding obligation by about five years
 Multi-Modal Mobility 	\$337 million	Limit decline of Mobility to D+
 Strategic Transit 	\$169 million	rather than to F Raise from D to C-
Transit – Urban	\$36 million	Raise from C to B
Transit Rural	\$36 million	Raise from C to B
Environmental	\$25 million	Establish at B
Bicycle & Pedestrian	\$10 million	Establish at B
Local Transportation	\$293 million	Varies by local jurisdiction





Guiding Principles

Proposals for funding transportation should prioritize:

- Long term sustainable revenue streams
- Local share for cities and counties
- Strategies for making increased investments over time
- Strategies to accelerate investments wherever possible
- Flexible funding sources to invest in alternative modes of transportation

Federal



Short Term -- Economic Stimulus (new Congress)
Long Term -- Federal Reauthorization

General Fund Allocation



Support Governor Ritter's Budget Submittal which includes \$30m annually for bridges in newly created Reserve Fund

Taxes



Incremental Examples (2008 \$):

Sales tax

0.1% = \$90 m/year

Income tax

0.1% = \$129 m/year

Fuel tax*

5¢ = \$115 m/year

Sales tax on fuel*

2.9% = \$178 m/year

Index fuel tax*

CPI = \$23m first year

Future VMT Options

VMT Pilot Proposed:

- o Vehicle miles traveled fee pricing
- o Vehicle emissions pricing



^{*}Constitutional amendment required to make revenues available for alternative modes

Pricing Transportation as a Utility

Evaluate utility pricing models

Trash collection
Water utility
Electrical utility
