	CONCERNING SUPPORT FOR A SINGLE-PAYER HEALTH CARE SYSTEM IN								
	COLORADO.								
	WHEREAS, Every Coloradan needs health care from conception to death; and								
	WHEREAS, The current method of funding health care is fragmented, costly, bureaucratic, and administratively wasteful; and								
WHEREAS, Funding health care through a risk-based system is insufficient to ensure health care for all Coloradans while containing costs; and									
	WHEREAS, Previous incremental reforms have failed to expand care and control costs; and								
	WHEREAS, Current limits on access to medical insurance lead to rationing of health care; and								
	WHEREAS, An economy whose workers depend on

1 2 3	employer-based health care, and whose employers are saddled with health care expenditures, is less competitive and dynamic than an economy that is free of such constraints; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, High copayments and insurance policy limitations further limit access to health care and force millions of hardworking, responsible Americans into medical bankruptcy; and
7 8 9	WHEREAS, Today's workers are unlikely to remain with the same employer for long periods of time and, as a result, repeatedly lose their health insurance; and
10 11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, A single-payer system is the only health plan submitted to the Lewin Group for analysis by the Blue Ribbon Commission for Health Care Reform established pursuant to Senate Bill 06-208 that would provide comprehensive health care financing while decreasing annual health spending in Colorado; and
15 16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, A single-payer system would cover all Coloradans for all medically necessary services, including doctor, hospital, rehabilitative, long-term, mental health, and home care services; dental, vision, prescription drug, and medical supply costs; and preventive and public health measures; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS, A single-payer system would unify the system of payments to providers, allow health outcomes and quality data to be centrally collected, and create incentives for life-long wellness; and
23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, A single-payer system would increase choice and competition by freeing patients to choose any health care provider, and would enable health care providers to provide the best medical care possible; and
27 28 29	WHEREAS, National health care reform may facilitate state implementation of innovative health care delivery systems; now, therefore,
30 31	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Sixty-seventh General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
32	That we, the members of the General Assembly, hereby:
33 34 35 36	(1) Find, determine, and declare that a single-payer health care system would streamline Colorado's health care system and save Colorado taxpayers approximately \$1.4 billion in health care costs annually;
37 38 39 40 41	(2) Find that a single-payer health care system would improve the delivery of services, enhance health outcomes, expand patient choice, broaden access to all medically necessary services, ensure the affordability of copayments, and create a focus on wellness and preventive care;
42	(3) Endorse a single-payer health care system in concept, and

1 2	support efforts to transition Colorado toward the more efficient, cohesive health care system represented by a single-payer approach; and
3 4 5	(4) Respectfully urge the United States Congress to enact health reform legislation that will allow Colorado to provide a universal, comprehensive single-payer system of high quality health insurance.
6 7 8	Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent to Barack Obama, President of the United States, and the members of the Colorado congressional delegation.
