	A BILL FOR AN ACT
101	CONCERNING ELIMINATING ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSES FROM THE
102	SPECIAL RELATIONSHIPS EXEMPTION CREATED FOR THE USE OF
103	PHYSICAL FORCE IN CERTAIN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

The bill leaves to the sole discretion of a physician, or a person acting under his or her direction, the authority to use reasonable and appropriate force in emergency situations for the purpose of administering a recognized form of treatment for the health of the patient.

- 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
- 2 SECTION 1. The introductory portion to 18-1-703 (1) (e) and
- 3 18-1-703 (1) (e) (II), Colorado Revised Statutes, are amended to read:
- **18-1-703.** Use of physical force special relationships. (1) The
- 5 use of physical force upon another person which would otherwise
- 6 constitute an offense is justifiable and not criminal under any of the
- 7 following circumstances:

- (e) A duly licensed physician, advanced practice nurse, or a person acting under his or her direction, may use reasonable and appropriate physical force for the purpose of administering a recognized form of treatment that he or she reasonably believes to be adapted to promoting the physical or mental health of the patient if:
- (II) The treatment is administered in an emergency when the physician or advanced practice nurse reasonably believes that no one competent to consent can be consulted and that a reasonable person, wishing to safeguard the welfare of the patient, would consent.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 11, 2010, if adjournment sine die is on May 12, 2010); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2010 and shall take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
