SUBJECT:

Fiscal Assessment of Proposed Amendment HB1316 L.001.

This memorandum is an assessment of the fiscal impact of the attached proposed amendment to **HB09-1316**. This fiscal assessment is for the impact of the bill with inclusion of this amendment <u>only</u>. Any other added amendment could influence the fiscal impact.

Summary of Proposed Amendment

Amendment L.001 removes the portion of the bill that allows law enforcement officials to have their personal information redacted if they believe that they or a member of their family is in danger of harm. If Amendment L.001 is adopted, the only provision remaining in the bill is the expansion of the existing crime of posting personal information about a peace officer on the Internet to include law enforcement officials. A violation of this crime is a class 1 misdemeanor.

Fiscal Impact of Amendment

The amendment eliminates the expenditure impact of \$3,849 General Fund shown in the fiscal note dated March 23, 2009. The existing statute prohibiting posting the information of a peace officer is used very rarely. In 2008, one case was filed under the existing statute. The expansion to include other law enforcement officials is not expected to cause a large increase in the number of these cases.

The bill may increase state revenue from fines, although less than \$5,000 in new state revenue is expected per year. According to Section 18-1.3-501, C.R.S., the penalty for a class 1 misdemeanor is 6 to 18 months imprisonment in a county jail, a fine of \$500 to \$5,000, or both. Fine revenue that is not otherwise appropriated is deposited into the Fines Collection Cash Fund. Because the courts have the discretion of incarceration, imposing a fine, or both, the impact to state revenue cannot be determined.
