101 **CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE STATE METHAMPHETAMINE**
102 **TASK FORCE.**

Bill Summary

Extends the repeal of the state methamphetamine task force to 2014. Makes conforming amendments.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** 18-18.5-103 (6) (a) and the introductory portion to

1 18-18.5-103 (6) (d), Colorado Revised Statutes, are amended to read:

2 **18-18.5-103. State methamphetamine task force - creation -**
3 **membership - duties.** (6) In addition, the task force shall:

4 (a) Meet at least ~~six~~ **FOUR** times each year from the date of the
5 first meeting until January 1, ~~2010~~ 2014, or more often as directed by the
6 chair of the task force;

7 (d) Submit a written report to the judiciary committees, or any
8 successor committees, of the senate and the house of representatives of
9 the general assembly by January 1, 2007, and by each January 1 thereafter
10 through January 1, ~~2010~~ 2014, at a minimum specifying the following:

11 **SECTION 2.** 18-18.5-105 (1) (a), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
12 amended to read:

13 **18-18.5-105. Cash fund - created.** (1) (a) All private and public
14 funds received by the task force or the division of criminal justice in the
15 department of public safety, on behalf of the task force, through grants,
16 contributions, and donations pursuant to this article shall be transmitted
17 to the state treasurer, who shall credit the same to the methamphetamine
18 abuse prevention, intervention, and treatment cash fund, which fund is
19 hereby created and referred to in this section as the "fund". The moneys
20 in the fund shall be subject to annual appropriation by the general
21 assembly for the direct and indirect costs associated with the
22 implementation of this article. All moneys in the fund not expended for
23 the purpose of this article may be invested by the state treasurer as
24 provided by law. All interest and income derived from the investment
25 and deposit of moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Any
26 unexpended and unencumbered moneys remaining in the fund at the end
27 of a fiscal year shall remain in the fund and shall not be credited or

1 transferred to the general fund or another fund. All unexpended and
2 unencumbered moneys remaining in the fund as of July 1, ~~2012~~ 2014,
3 shall be transferred to the general fund.

4 **SECTION 3.** 18-18.5-106, Colorado Revised Statutes, is
5 amended to read:

6 **18-18.5-106. Repeal of article.** This article is repealed, effective
7 July 1, ~~2010~~ 2014.

8 **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
9 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
10 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
