Summary of Legislation

The bill requires that citizens present photo identification when voting. Specifically, it eliminates several forms of non-photo identifications allowed under current law.

State Expenditures

The bill will require the Department of State to re-print voter registration and other forms at an estimated one-time cost of \$13,591 in FY 2009-10. Although many of these forms are available online, the department is required to provide voter registration forms to county clerk and recorders, voter registration drive organizers, and designated agencies that conduct voter registration under the National Voter Registration Act. The cost of reprinting forms would be paid from the Department of State Cash Fund.

State Appropriations

The fiscal note indicates that the Department of State would require a cash funds appropriation of \$13,591 from the Department of State Cash Fund for FY 2009-10.
