TITLE: CONCERNING THE USE OF MONEYS IN THE COLORADO CUSTOMIZED TRAINING PROGRAM.**Summary of Legislation**

This bill is recommended by the Joint Select Committee on Job Creation and Economic Growth. It expands the allowable uses of funds from the Colorado Customized Job Training program to include employee training efforts focused on Colorado's new energy economy. The bill was signed by the Governor and became law on May 4, 2009.

Background

The Colorado Customized Job Training program is a collaborative effort between higher education, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Labor and Employment, and the Department of Local Affairs to provide grants to employees to receive customized job training conducted at community colleges or at private companies. In FY 2009-10, the program was appropriated \$2.7 million.

Assessment

This bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact. It expands the allowable uses of funds from the job training program. While total program costs are unchanged, money may be spread across additional training programs.
