28 DRAWN FROM THE STATEWIDE VOTER REGISTRATION DATABASE. For
29 electors who voted, the list shall show such elector's method of voting,
30 whether by early voting, mail-in ballot, mail ballot, polling place voting,
31 or otherwise.

33 (2) Upon receipt of the lists, the secretary of state shall ~~compare~~
34 ~~them with the master list of registered electors maintained in the office~~
35 EXAMINE THE LISTS TO SEE WHICH ELECTORS DID AND DID NOT VOTE IN
36 THE ELECTION in order to ascertain if any elector has voted more than
37 once. If it is determined that an elector has voted more than once, the
38 secretary of state shall notify the proper district attorney for prosecution
39 of a violation of the provisions of this code.
