THE COUNTY OF ORIGIN CONSTRUCTION CASH FUND IS HEREBY CREATED IN THE STATE TREASURY. THE FUND SHALL CONSIST OF ALL MONEYS CREDITED TO THE FUND PURSUANT TO SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (B) OF SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF PARAGRAPH (a) OF SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION. EIGHTY-FIVE PERCENT OF THE MONEY SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED IN PROPORTION TO THE AMOUNT OF SAID FEDERAL LEASING MONEY DERIVED FROM EACH OF THE RESPECTIVE COUNTIES, AND FIFTEEN PERCENT OF THE MONEY SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO COUNTIES WHERE ENERGY CONVERSION TAKES PLACE IN PROPORTION TO THE AMOUNT OF ENERGY THAT IS CONVERTED IN EACH COUNTY. A COUNTY SHALL KEEP A PORTION OF THE MONEYS AND FURTHER DISTRIBUTE THE REMAINDER TO MUNICIPALITIES LOCATED WITHIN THE COUNTY BASED ON THE FORMULA SET FORTH IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF PARAGRAPH (c) OF SUBSECTION (5.4) OF THIS SECTION. THE COUNTY AND MUNICIPALITIES SHALL USE MONEYS RECEIVED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (6.5) FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC FACILITIES.
