7     department applies the 2.5 percent salary survey increase reflected in the salary survey line item appropriations, each employee shall receive a base-building  
8     increase up to the range maximum, and that salary survey increase amounts over the range maximum shall not be base-building.

10    58     Department of Law, Legal Services to State Agencies -- In making this appropriation, it is the intent of the General Assembly that hourly billing rates charged  
11    by the Department for legal services to state agencies not exceed \$102.79 per hour for attorneys and not exceed \$78.73 per hour for legal assistants, which  
12    equates to a blended rate of \$99.01 per hour..

14    59     Department of Law, Special Purpose, Litigation Management and Technology -- It is the intent of the General Assembly to grant the Department of Law  
15    additional flexibility by allowing the Department to use moneys appropriated in this line item to address unanticipated state legal needs that arise during FY
