Summary of Legislation

The bill directs the Water Resources Review Committee to study during the 2014 interim, best practices to limit municipal outdoor water consumption. The WRRC can propose legislation to facilitate the implementation of those best practices that are both reasonable and likely to result in the measurable conservation of municipal water used for outdoor purposes. The bill is repealed September 1, 2015.

State Expenditures

The WRRC is scheduled to meet six times during the 2014 interim, with staff support from the Office of Legislative Legal Services and the Legislative Council. Depending on the number of issues that the WRRC plans to study during the interim, the study of best practices may result in an increase in workload for these offices but is not expected to increase the number of meetings to be held or to require new appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect April 11, 2014.
