A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING A REQUIREMENT THAT A LEGAL NOTICE PUBLISHED IN A**
102 **NEWSPAPER IS ALSO PUBLISHED ON A STATEWIDE WEB SITE**
103 **MAINTAINED BY A MAJORITY OF COLORADO NEWSPAPERS.**

Bill Summary

Any newspaper that publishes legal notices is required, at no additional cost, to also place each notice on a statewide web site established and maintained by an organization representing a majority of Colorado newspapers as a repository for the notices.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-70-103, **add** (5)
3 as follows:

4 **24-70-103. Requisites of legal newspaper.** (5) WHEN ANY
5 LEGAL NOTICE IS REQUIRED BY LAW TO BE PUBLISHED IN ANY NEWSPAPER,
6 THE NEWSPAPER PUBLISHING THE NOTICE SHALL, AT NO ADDITIONAL COST
7 TO THE PERSON OR ENTITY PLACING THE NOTICE, PLACE THE NOTICE ON A
8 STATEWIDE WEB SITE ESTABLISHED AND MAINTAINED BY AN
9 ORGANIZATION REPRESENTING A MAJORITY OF COLORADO NEWSPAPERS
10 AS A REPOSITORY FOR THE NOTICES. ■ ■

11 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date -**
12 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following
13 the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the
14 general assembly (August 6, 2014, if adjournment sine die is on May 7,
15 2014); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1
16 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section,
17 or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part
18 will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election
19 to be held in November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the
20 date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

21 (2) This act applies to notices published on or after January 1,
22 2015.
