(III) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, ON JULY 1, 2013, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL DEDUCT FORTY-EIGHT MILLION TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND AND TRANSFER SUCH SUM TO THE STATE EDUCATION FUND CREATED IN SECTION 17 (4) OF ARTICLE IX OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION.".
