"shall consist CONSISTS of nine ELEVEN members, seven NINE of whom shall be ARE appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate and two of whom, the executive director of the department of natural 6 resources and the executive director of the department of public health and environment, shall be ARE ex officio voting NONVOTING members. At least two The Governor shall appoint the nine voting members IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING:

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(A) **Geographical representation.** AT LEAST THREE members 12 shall be appointed from west of the continental divide, ONE MEMBER FROM THE EASTERN SLOPE, and, to the extent possible, consistent with this paragraph (a), the other members shall be appointed taking into account 15 the need for geographical representation of other areas of the state with 16 high levels of oil and gas activity or employment. THE MEMBER 17 APPOINTED FROM THE EASTERN SLOPE AND AT LEAST ONE MEMBER 18 APPOINTED FROM WEST OF THE CONTINENTAL DIVIDE MUST BE MEMBERS 19 WITH SUBSTANTIAL EXPERIENCE IN THE OIL AND GAS INDUSTRY.

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(B) **Particular qualifications.** Three FIVE members shall be individuals with MUST HAVE substantial experience in the oil and gas industry, and at least two of said three THOSE FIVE members shall MUST have a college degree in petroleum geology or petroleum engineering; one member shall be a local government official; one member shall have formal training or substantial experience in environmental or wildlife protection; one member shall have formal training or substantial experience in soil conservation or reclamation; and one member shall be actively engaged in agricultural production and also be a royalty owner.

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(C) **Political party affiliation.** Excluding the executive directors from consideration, no more than four FIVE members of the commission shall be members of the same political party.".
