Where a rental agreement, as defined in section 38-21.5-101 (6), is entered into between the owner and 9 10 the occupant, the owner of a self-service storage facility and his or her 11 heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns have a lien upon 12 all personal property located at the self-service storage facility for rent, 13 labor, or other charges, present or future, in relation to the personal 14 property and for expenses necessary for its preservation or expenses 15 reasonably incurred in its sale or other disposition pursuant to this article. The lien attaches as of the date the personal property is brought to the 16 17 self-service storage facility and continues so long as the owner retains 18 possession and until the default is corrected, or a sale is conducted, or the 19 property is otherwise disposed of to satisfy the lien.
