Amend printed bill, page 3, line 17, after the period add "PUBLIC ENTITY OCCUPANCY AND USE DOES NOT INCLUDE OPENING A PORTION OF A HIGHWAY OR BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT TO TRAFFIC PRIOR TO COMPLETION OF THE FINAL CONFIGURATION.".

Page 3, strike lines 19 through 21 and substitute "PAID BY PARAGRAPH (c) OF THIS SUBSECTION (1) UNTIL A COMPREHENSIVE LIST OF ITEMS TO BE COMPLETED OR CORRECTED IS APPROVED BY THE PUBLIC ENTITY. A PUBLIC ENTITY MAY WITHHOLD TWICE THE AMOUNT OF".

Page 3, line 23, after "DAYS" insert "OR THE NEXT SCHEDULED MONTHLY PAYMENT".
