Amend printed bill, strike everything below the enacting clause and
substitute:

40 "**SECTION 1.** 23-18-202 (2) (b) and (2) (e), Colorado Revised 41 Statutes, are amended to read:

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43 23-18-202. College opportunity fund - appropriations payment of stipends - reimbursement - repeal. (2) (b) For the state 44 fiscal year commencing July 1, 2005, and for state fiscal years thereafter, 45 46 for an eligible undergraduate student attending a state institution of higher education, the specified amount of the stipend per credit hour shall be an 47 amount set annually by the general assembly, which in no case shall 48 49 exceed the student's total in-state tuition. The value of the per credit hour 50 stipend shall be the same for each eligible undergraduate student, regardless of the state institution of higher education that the student 51 52 attends. The student shall be responsible for paying the student's share of 53 total in-state tuition, if any.

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55 (2) (e) (I) FOR FISCAL YEARS BEGINNING PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2011, 56 an eligible undergraduate student who attends a participating private

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1 institution of higher education may receive financial assistance under this 2 part 2 in the amount of fifty percent of the stipend amount; except that the 3 amount of the stipend under this paragraph (e) SUBPARAGRAPH (I) may 4 increase in proportion to the percent of unfunded enrollment growth that 5 is appropriated to the governing boards pursuant to section 23-5-129 (8). 6 7 (II) FOR FISCAL YEARS BEGINNING ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2011, AN 8 ELIGIBLE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT WHO ATTENDS A PARTICIPATING 9 PRIVATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION MAY RECEIVE THE FULL 10 AMOUNT OF THE STIPEND SET FOR THE APPLICABLE FISCAL YEAR 11 PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION (2).
