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(a) The availability of counseling services;

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(b) The availability of longer term residential arrangements; and

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(c) The possibility of referral to the county department.

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(3) The state department shall develop a written statement of the 14 rights and counseling services set forth in subsection (2) of this section and shall distribute the statement to each law enforcement agency, 16 licensed child care facility, and licensed homeless youth shelter, AND LICENSED HOST FAMILY HOME. Each law enforcement officer taking a youth into custody pursuant to this article shall provide the youth and the youth's parent with a copy of the statement. Each licensed child care 20 facility, and licensed homeless youth shelter, AND LICENSED HOST FAMILY HOME shall provide each resident youth and the youth's parent with a copy of the statement.
