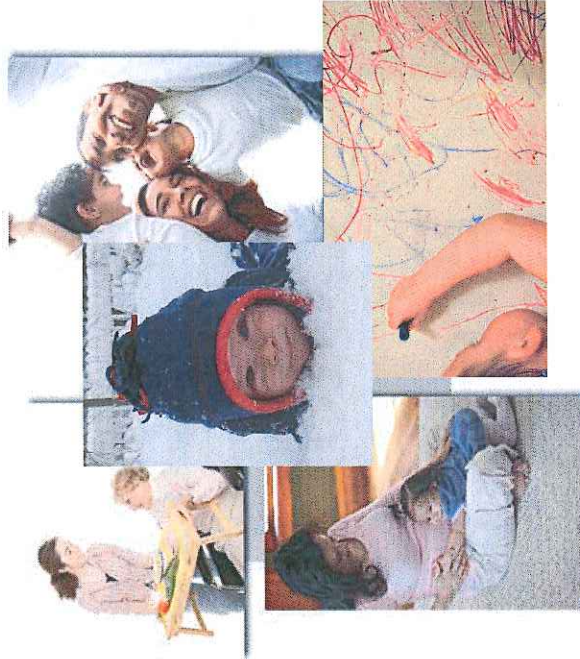

CICP Background

- House Bill 83-1129 “Reform Act for the Provision of Health Care for the Indigent”
- Financing mechanism to partially offset cost of care provided to low-income Coloradans

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Who Does CIGCP Serve?

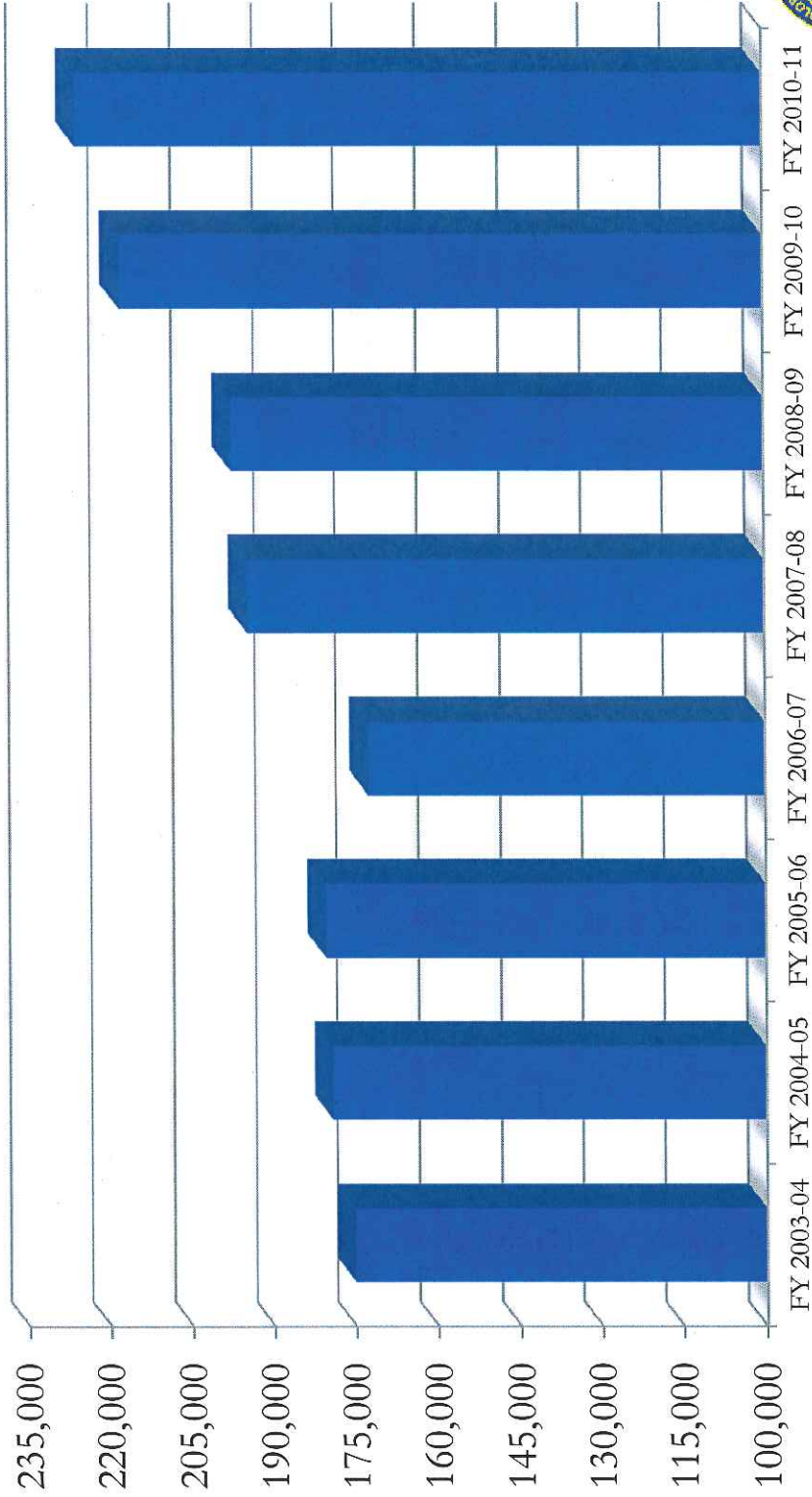
- **Colorado resident or migrant worker**
- **Lawfully Present**
 - HB 06S-1023
 - Annual Report to State, Veterans and Military Affairs Committee each January 15
- **Up to 250% FPL**
 - \$55,125 for a family of four
- **Not eligible for Medicaid or CHIP+**
- **Sliding fee copayment based on income**

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CICP Client Caseload

• FY 2010-11: 225,906



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CICP Providers

- **68 providers**
 - 48 hospitals and 20 clinics
 - **178 sites throughout state**
 - **Providers prioritize care within available funding**
 - Emergency Care for the Full Year
 - Urgent Care
 - Any Other Medical Care
 - **All care must be medically necessary**

- **FQHCs, Rural Health Centers, and state licensed community health clinics**



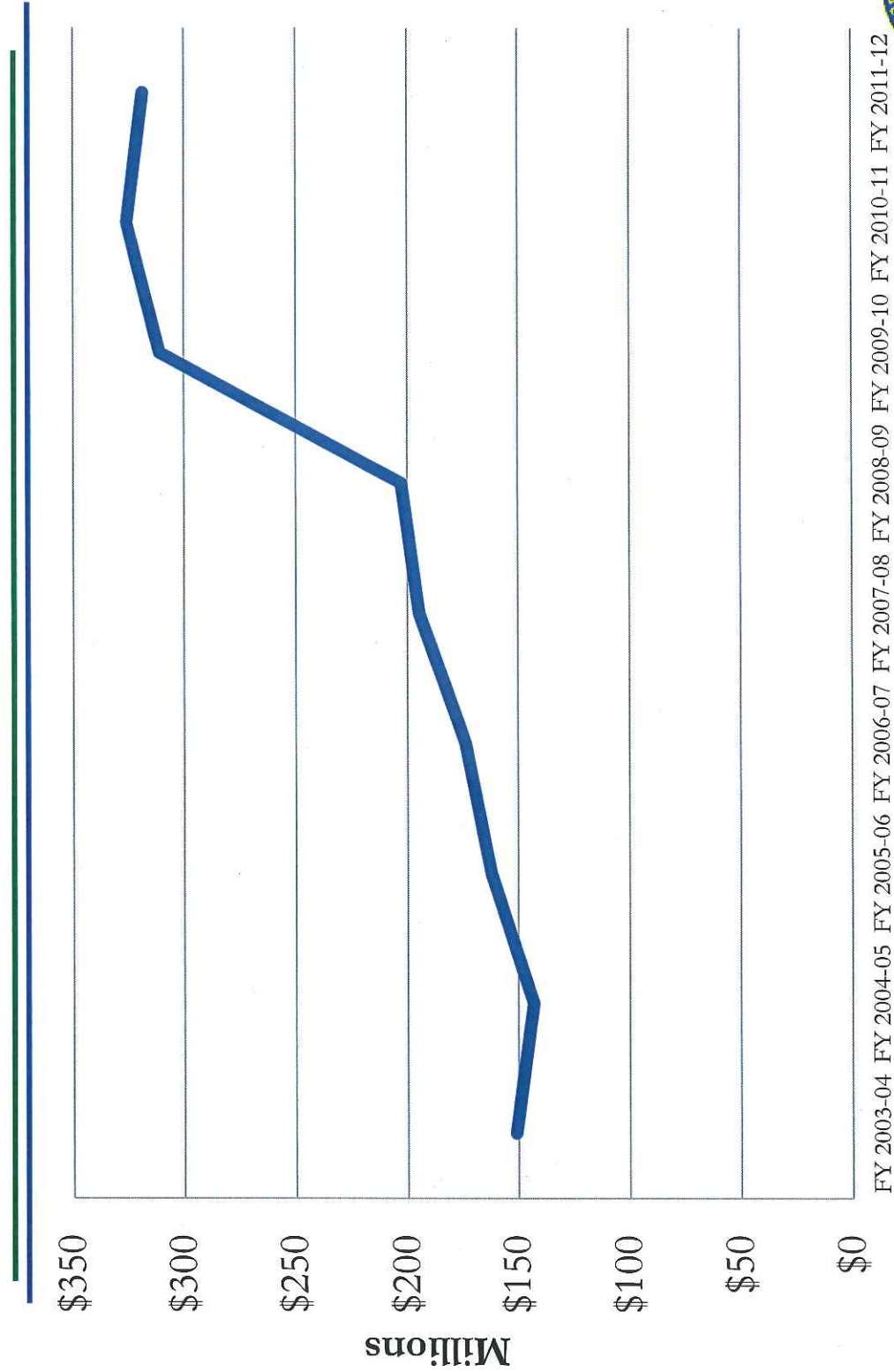
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CICP Reimbursement – FY 2010-11

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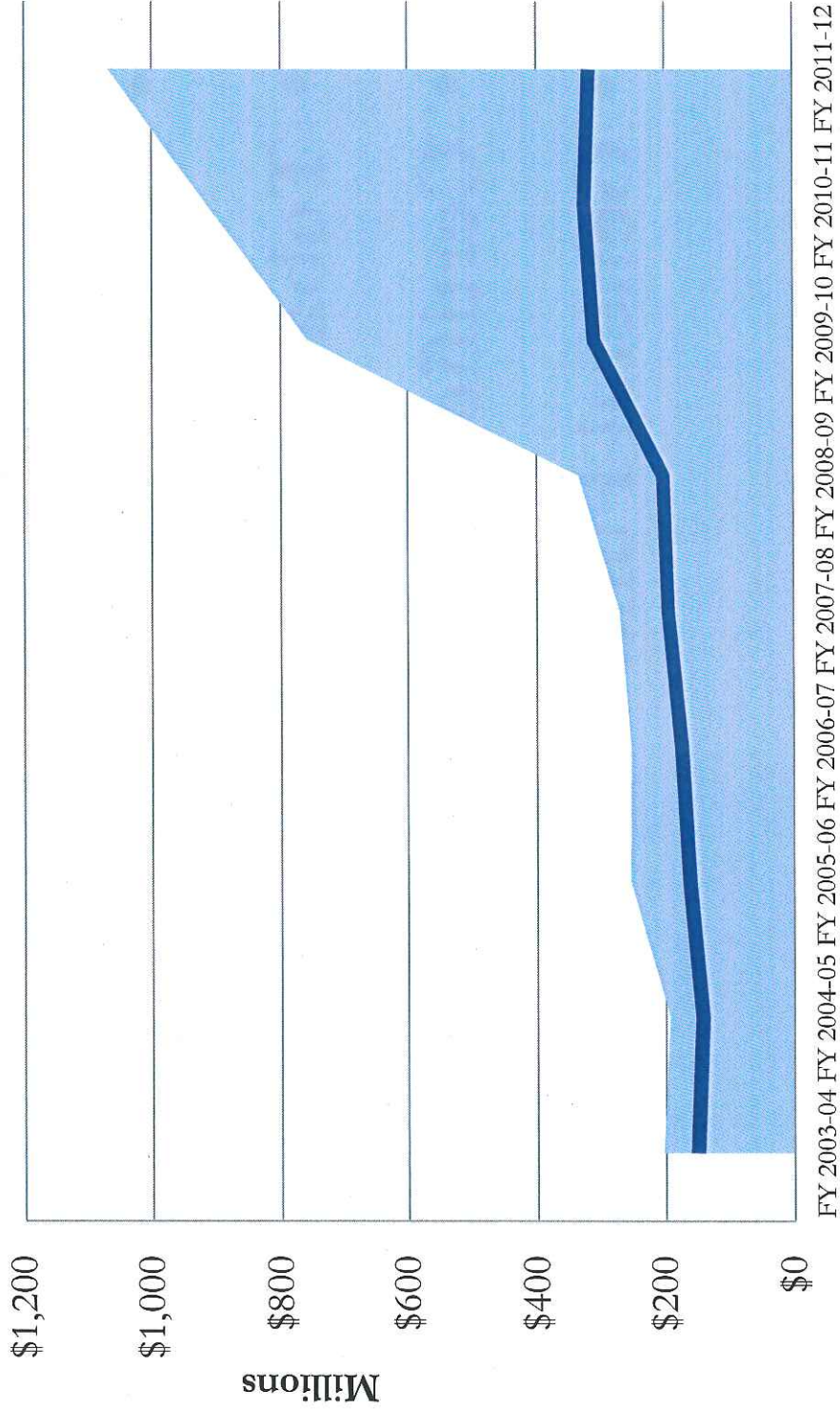
Safety Net Programs

- Administers funding to qualified medical providers who serve the indigent population
- Researches methods for leveraging federal funds, and funds from other sources, to offset the expenditure of General Funds

Safety Net Programs

- **Old Age Pension Health and Medical Care Program**

- Established in 1956 through Section 7 of Article XXIV of the Colorado State Constitution

- **Colorado Indigent Care Program (HB83-1129)**

- **School Health Services Program (SB97-101)**

- **Primary Care Fund (HB05-1262)**

- Amendment 35 Tobacco Taxes for Health Related Purposes



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Safety Net Programs

- **Nursing Facility Provider Fee** (HB08-1144)
- **Hospital Provider Fee** (HB09-1293)
- **Other line items / financing mechanisms**
 - Commission on Family Medicine Residency Training Program
 - State University Teaching Hospitals
 - Pediatric Specialty Hospital
 - Upper Payment Limit financing
