HB12-1121 be amended as follows:

Amend printed bill, strike everything below the enacting clause and substitute:

"SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-2-124, amend (1) (c) (I) (E) as follows:

40-2-124. Renewable energy standard - definitions - net metering - legislative declaration. (1) Each provider of retail electric service in the state of Colorado, other than municipally owned utilities that serve forty thousand customers or fewer, shall be considered a qualifying retail utility. Each qualifying retail utility, with the exception of cooperative electric associations that have voted to exempt themselves from commission jurisdiction pursuant to section 40-9.5-104 and municipally owned utilities, shall be subject to the rules established under this article by the commission. No additional regulatory authority of the commission other than that specifically contained in this section is provided or implied. In accordance with article 4 of title 24, C.R.S., the commission shall revise or clarify existing rules to establish the following:

- (c) Electric resource standards:
- (I) Except as provided in subparagraph (V) of this paragraph (c), the electric resource standards shall require each qualifying retail utility to generate, or cause to be generated, electricity from eligible energy resources in the following minimum amounts:
- (E) Thirty percent of its retail electricity sales in Colorado for the years 2020 and thereafter, with distributed generation equaling at least three percent of its retail electricity sales; EXCEPT THAT, IF THE COMMISSION FINDS THAT ACHIEVING THESE STANDARDS WOULD CREATE AN UNDUE FINANCIAL BURDEN ON RATEPAYERS, THE COMMISSION MAY SUSPEND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (E) FOR UP TO TEN YEARS.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 40-3-106.5 as follows:

40-3-106.5. Ratepayers' bill of rights - guidelines for commission - legislative declaration. The General assembly finds, determines, and declares that the interests of working Colorado families, small businesses, and other consumers of the products and services of investor-owned public utilities are often not adequately recognized in the commission's

THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION SHALL REQUIRE 2 INVESTOR-OWNED PUBLIC UTILITIES TO SHARE TRANSPARENT AND 3 UNDERSTANDABLE RATE INCREASE INFORMATION WITH THE PUBLIC WHEN 4 MAKING A RATE INCREASE REQUEST, INCLUDING USING ADVANCED 5 INFORMATION PROCESSING CAPABILITIES TO ESTIMATE, UPON REQUEST, 6 THE MONTHLY COST TO IDENTIFIED GROUPS OF CUSTOMERS RATHER THAN 7 ONLY TO A HYPOTHETICAL AVERAGE CUSTOMER. THIS SECTION SHALL BE 8 KNOWN AND MAY BE CITED AS THE "UTILITY RATEPAYERS' BILL OF 9 RIGHTS". 10
 - **SECTION 3. Applicability.** The provisions of this act apply to all cases filed on or after the effective date of this act.
 - **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.".
