Religions Practices

Be it enacted by the voters of the State of Colorado:

Section 32 of article II of the Colorado Constitution is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION to read:

(4) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:

(a) "RIGHT TO ACT" MEANS THE ABILITY TO ENGAGE IN RELIGIOUS PRACTICES IN THE PRIVACY OF A PERSON'S HOME OR IN THE PRIVACY OF A RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATION'S ESTABLISHED PLACE OF WORSHIP.

(b) "REFUSAL TO ACT" MEANS THE ABILITY TO REJECT ONE OR MORE RELIGIOUS PRACTICES IN THE PRIVACY OF A PERSON'S HOME OR IN THE PRIVACY OF A RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATION'S ESTABLISHED PLACE OF WORSHIP.
