Ballot Initiative Proposal #4: Creating WC public defender office

Shall \$5 million annually of recreational marijuana tax revenues be spent to establish and operate the Colorado Worker's Compensation Public Defender, to investigate and prosecute worker's compensation fraud against mentally disabled claimants, to guarantee accommodation and statutory rights (C.R.S. 8-43-211(1)(c) to "be represented by an attorney" to mentally disabled claimants, with powers to provide 3T MRI brainscans immediately without charge, with power to control videocamera recordings of all court lobbies, hearing and prehearing rooms, with power to review all denied claims for fact finding error, fraud, bribes, organized crime, entrapment, disability discrimination, denial of due process or Constitutional rights, and with power to enter any business to find a person or inspect records or shut a business down, with power to investigate, prosecute, or remove administrative law judges, OAC staff, division staff or cancel business or professional licenses of employers, attorneys, or insurance companies for fraud, cruelty, family destruction, false criminal charges against mentally disabled claimants, disability discrimination, collusion, misuse of public office, abuse of discretion, denial of due process or Constitutional rights, or operating contrary to law or the public's best interests. Leftover funds shall revert to the Colorado Brain Injury Project for individual grants for cognitive rehab or family support.
