Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 03/07/07 Legislative Council Staff Revised Fiscal Note was Prepared (Amended by the House Appropriations Committee 04/11/07 and by the House Committee of the Whole 04/12/07)

The House Appropriations amendment added an appropriations clause, which is discussed below in the "Amendments/Appropriation Status" section.

The House Committee of the Whole amendment:

- 1. Excludes the following from the bill's credentialing requirements: friends and family who provide in-home care, individuals who provide self-care, technicians-in-training who are supervised by a physician or a qualified nurse.
- 2. Eliminates a provision that allows the Department of Public Health and Environment to impose civil penalties up to \$1000 per violation.
- 3. Requires dialysis clinics to inform clients via publicly posted notice or via a written document of the manner in which they can provide feedback to the clinic.

These amendments do <u>not</u> alter the fiscal impact of the bill as indicated in the March 7, 2007 Legislative Council Staff Revised Fiscal Note. Legislative Council Staff agrees with this analysis.

The appropriation clause in the reengrossed bill provides \$5,862 General Fund and 0.1 FTE to the Department of Public Health and Environment's Health Facilities and Emergency Medical Services
