Summary of Legislation

This bill allows members of the armed forces who are permanently stationed in Colorado, and who hold a valid driver's license from another state, to enroll in a MOST course for the same charge as a Colorado resident. The MOST program is managed by the Colorado Department of Transportation to develop the knowledge, attitudes, habits, and skills needed for safe motorcycle operation. Under current law, only Colorado residents holding a current valid Colorado driver's license, a minor driver's license, or an instruction permit are allowed to enroll in the MOST course.

State Revenue

The expansion of people eligible for the MOST course is estimated to increase state revenue by \$55,000. Currently, roughly 10,000 people annually participate in the MOST course. CDOT has refused 1,100 more applicants annually who are considered ineligible because they are in the armed forces. This note assumes 1,100 members of the armed forces (1,100 at \$50) will participate annually in the course. These funds cover the cost of the program.

State Expenditures

This fiscal note assumes there would be a corresponding need for \$55,000 in expenditures from the MOST Fund.

State Appropriation

No appropriation is required as these funds are allocated by the Colorado Transportation Commission to the Office of Safety, CDOT, for immediate use (Section 43-5-504, C.R.S.).
