**Local Government Impact:** Metropolitan sewage disposal districts will increase board member compensation while reducing the number of board members.

## **Summary of Legislation**

This bill modifies representation on a metropolitan sewage disposal district board that has 11 or more member municipalities from one representative for every 25,000 people in the district to one representative for every 75,000 people. It increases the annual compensation of board members from \$2,000 to \$3,000. The bill also:

- allows such district boards in existence prior to the bill's effective date to consist of one representative for every 25,000 people in the district until the next board reapportionment; and
- requires these boards to be reapportioned every four years after the creation of the district instead of the current two-year period.

## **Local Government Impact**

Metropolitan sewage disposal districts that have 11 or more member municipalities must increase the annual compensation to their board members from \$2,000 to \$3,000. However, upon the board's reapportionment, the board membership is decreased from one representative for every

25,000 people to one representative for every 75,000 people when the district is reapportioned. The initial increased compensation will be eventually offset by the decrease in board members once a board's reapportionment occurs.
