A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE CREATION OF AN ADVISORY BOARD TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING COMPETENCY EVALUATIONS IN ADULT CRIMINAL CASES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Legislative Oversight Committee for the Continuing Examination of the Treatment of Persons with Mental Illness who are Involved in the Criminal and Juvenile Justice Systems. Creates an advisory board to study and recommend standards regarding the level of training, education, and experience that a psychiatrist or psychologist shall have to be qualified to perform competency evaluations in criminal

cases. Outlines the membership of the advisory board. Schedules the advisory board for repeal in 2010.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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2 **SECTION 1.** Article 8 of title 16, Colorado Revised Statutes, is 3 amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to read: 4 16-8-106.5. Competency evaluation advisory board - creation 5 - membership - duties - repeal. (1) THERE IS HEREBY CREATED THE 6 COMPETENCY EVALUATION ADVISORY BOARD, REFERRED TO IN THIS 7 SECTION AS THE "ADVISORY BOARD", IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN 8 SERVICES THAT SHALL STUDY AND RECOMMEND STANDARDS TO THE STATE 9 BOARD OF HUMAN SERVICES REGARDING THE LEVEL OF TRAINING, 10 EDUCATION, AND EXPERIENCE THAT A PSYCHIATRIST OR PSYCHOLOGIST 11 SHALL HAVE TO BE CONSIDERED QUALIFIED TO PERFORM COMPETENCY 12 EVALUATIONS IN CRIMINAL CASES PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 16-8-106 AND 13 16-8-111. THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL ADDITIONALLY MAKE 14 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE STATE BOARD OF HUMAN SERVICES 15 CONCERNING STANDARDS FOR CONDUCTING AND REPORTING THE 16 COMPETENCY EVALUATIONS. 17 (2) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN 18 SERVICES, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE, SHALL SERVE AS CHAIR OF THE 19 ADVISORY BOARD AND SHALL APPOINT THE REMAINING MEMBERS OF THE 20 ADVISORY BOARD. THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL CONSIST OF UP TO 21 **FOURTEEN** MEMBERS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO: 22 (a) A PSYCHIATRIST WHO IS TRAINED IN FORENSIC COMPETENCY 23 ASSESSMENTS: 24 (b) A LICENSED PSYCHOLOGIST WHO IS TRAINED IN FORENSIC 25 COMPETENCY ASSESSMENTS;

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1	(c) A LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER WHO IS TRAINED IN
2	FORENSIC COMPETENCY ASSESSMENTS;
3	(d) A LICENSED PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR WHO IS TRAINED IN

5	(e) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNIT WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF
6	HUMAN SERVICES THAT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES;
7	(f) A PERSON WHO REPRESENTS DISTRICT ATTORNEYS WITHIN THE
8	STATE;
9	(g) A PERSON WHO REPRESENTS DEFENSE ATTORNEYS WITHIN THE
10	STATE;
11	(h) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE TASK FORCE ESTABLISHED
12	PURSUANT TO SECTION 18-1.9-104, C.R.S.;
13	(i) A FAMILY MEMBER OF A PERSON WHO HAD BEEN SUBJECT TO
14	THE COMPETENCY EVALUATION PROCESS AT SOME <u>TIME</u> ;
15	(j) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT; AND
16	(k) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COLORADO MENTAL HEALTH
17	INSTITUTE AT PUEBLO.
18	(3) THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND
19	RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES NO LATER
20	THAN JANUARY 30, 2008, AND NO LATER THAN JANUARY 30 EACH YEAR
21	THEREAFTER.
22	(4) Based on the recommendations of the advisory board,
23	THE STATE BOARD OF HUMAN SERVICES SHALL PROMULGATE RULES AND
24	ADOPT PROCEDURES TO ESTABLISH AND IMPLEMENT THE STANDARDS
25	IDENTIFIED IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION.
26	(5) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2010.
27	SECTION 2. 26-1-107 (6), Colorado Revised Statutes, is

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1	amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:
2	26-1-107. State board of human services. (6) The state board
